The children receive free books, examination papers and sit the government exams in O'levels and A'levels as school candidates and not as private candidates.

ACADEMICS

- 95% of students in O'Levels, A'S Level & A' Levels are those who had their education through out from Primary at Alethea.
- At London O' Levels Aletheans achieved a 100% pass rate in the 12 key subjects offered. This included an 80% pass rate being A's or B's.

OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS

- Most recently Alethea is proud of being placed first in the island and winning the all-Island Trophy of English Drama for the **Mother Sri Lanka** competition held on Saturday the June 20, 2010 at Temple Trees under the patronage of His Excellency President Mahinda Rajapaksa. Students from 2600 schools participated, of which 43 schools were selected for the finals. The Alethean team won the 1st place in both English Medium drama and Power point presentation.
